
4. Humility

Pride is the #1 killer of saving faith. Indicators of ______ include: an unwillingness to examine our lives for sin/error; unwilling to ______ or ask forgiveness for how we have contributed to a problem; blaming others for things we were responsible for; an unwillingness to get help learning a better approach; etc. Proud people should not expect to have fruitful lives because God opposes them (James 4:6).

Humility is God's ______ gate (Matt. 5:5, Phi.l 2:5-7). Humble people: accept responsibility; look for their sins/errors and are quick to confess them; risk for the sake of others; are open and transparent; ask for help; are more concerned for the spiritual well being of others than their own reputation; initiate reconciliation; etc.. Humble people are well positioned to be used by God for ______ things.

5. Repentance

Teach the following "FIVE" (or your own version) to your kids, grandkids. Then model this pattern for them by authentically doing it yourself. More is ______ than is taught. Don't expect them to need Jesus if you don't seem to. Kids need more than words, they need a ______ example to follow.



Broken relationships require humility and repentance to be restored. Take humble, diligent ______ here; don't allow pride to jeopardize the souls of your progeny. Be quick to ask God, your spouse, kids, others, questions like, "What have I neglected? Where have I been passive? Have I been domineering? Have I wronged you in any way?" The more distant you are, the longer it may take for the answers to come. Do the FIVE for ______ that is legitimately your error; regardless how small it may seem to you. Patiently persevere in this pattern and you'll be amazed at how the gospel brings new life into damaged relationships.

Generally, discipleship/relational barriers with your kids will translate into barriers with your grandkids. You simply can't bypass 1st base to get to 2nd. Take greater <u>initiative</u> (relational, humble, repentant, transparent, honest, availability, prayer etc.) with your kids than grandkids. At the same time, work with whoever is

6. Prayer

Prayer is absolutely ______. Nobody comes to Christ but by the Holy Spirit (John 6:65). Regular, persistent, fervent prayer is the most powerful weapon we can wage against the enemy. We want to continually grow in Biblical prayer (Ex. Psalm 86, Daniel 6, Luke 18:1-8 etc.). Also, there are many great books on prayer.

<u>Caution</u>. If we ignore parts of God's Word or willfully remain in sin, then all our religious activities may be worthless. It may be that God is not even listening to any of our prayers. (Prov. 28:9, ls. 1:13-20, Jer. 14:11-12, Jer. 36:5-8, Amos 5:21-24)

If we think, "All I can do is pray," think instead, "Have I really done all I'm called to?" Never use the "All we can do is pray" as an ______ to avoid a difficult path such as: asking some hard questions about our past approach, inviting critique of our current approach, repenting, humbly seeking forgiveness, learning a new approach, getting help, etc. God knows the ______ of our hearts. Let's encourage each other toward wholehearted, sacrificial obedience to God's Word.
